Lealands continues to go from strength to strength as we reflect on fantastic GCSE results, a massive range of wider opportunities provided to students, continuous improvements in learning and progress and an enormous range of wider support for students and families that our staff provide. ## **Severe Weather Procedure**

Occasionally during the year, particularly in Winter, we experience spells of very bad weather (e.g. snow). During these times we will always do our very best to keep the school open. However, there may be occasions that we have to make the decision to close based on:

- the safety and wellbeing of students and staff
- the number of teachers who are able to safely travel to school to determine if we have adequate numbers of teachers to take classes
- the severity of the weather, which impacts on whether the school grounds are safe for students, teachers and visitors

In the event that the school has to close, we will always endeavour to give as much notice as possible. The school will follow these procedures to notify parents/carers:

- **Update the school website** a message will appear in red running across the top of the home screen, this should be your first point of reference.
- **App Message**\* parents/carers who have downloaded our MyED Parent App will receive a message directly to the app. \*Please ensure you have your notifications turned on so you are notified as soon as the message comes through.
- **Text Message**\* parents/carers who have not downloaded our MyED Parent App, will receive a text message. \*Please ensure you inform us if any of your contact details change so we always have the most up to date information for you. Failure to do so may result in messages not being received.
- Social Media Updates keep an eye on our Facebook, Instagram and Twitter pages for updates.
- Inform Local Authority The school will inform Luton Borough Council, who have a page dedicated to school closures. This can be found on their website at <a href="http://www.luton.gov.uk/schoolclosures">http://www.luton.gov.uk/schoolclosures</a>
- Local radio stations no longer update live lists on their websites (although they will read out lists on air).

Unfortunately, research suggests that children's love of reading declines as they get older through secondary school. Studies show that while 33% of 7-year-olds say they 'love' reading, this drops to 29% at age 10 and further declines to just a quarter (25%) by age 11.

This could be down to a number of factors, including students associating with reading as a younger activity. However, with more exposure to more challenging books and a wide selection of choice, students' love for literature will continue!

#### The Art of DJing

This term, a select group of Year 10 and 11 students have taken part in a 10 week programme called The Art of Djing.

The programme integrated DJing, songwriting, podcasting and content creation. Students were able to use professional equipment throughout the sessions giving them an insight into what it is like to be a professional DJ.

In week 1 through to week 6, students were introduced into the art of DJing, music production and songwriting. At first, some students were a little nervous of the decks but with encouragement, all were able to mix songs competently.

In week 7, students looked into the art of podcasting. They were encouraged to share thoughts, feelings and interests on a range of subjects. An interesting topic our students wanted to talk about, was the area where they live and the opportunities available to them. To assist them with this, an ex-student, Kadeem, visited a session to discuss school and his job now. He shared that he works for a company called Disguise which runs 95% of the touring set up for live events globally including Jay Z and Beyonce.

Students at the beginning of the programme set goals and these were discussed with the mentors during a number of sessions. They got them thinking about their ambitions and challenges they may face along the way.

Feedback from the students was very encouraging and they thoroughly enjoyed the sessions. Students said it opened their eyes to opportunities in the music world and how they could get into this if they were interested.

This project aims to give female students the opportunities to engage in fitness, martial arts and boxing. The project aims to promote physical fitness, self- discipline, and self-confidence among the participants.

It is part of a pilot project which Lealands has been a part of for 2 terms. As well as the physical aspect of the sessions, the program also has a mentoring element. During the mentoring sessions, the following areas may be discussed depending on the need of the student: academic problems, peer pressure, depression, bullying, raised by single parents, parental pressure, physical image, drug and alcohol abuse, poverty, obesity and other health problems and materialism.

There are currently 12 Year 8 girls accessing this programme which started in September and will run until Christmas. Feedback from students is that they are enjoying the sessions and look forward to them weekly. They have reported that they are learning a new skill and boxing helps to get frustrations out in a positive way.

#### **Year 11 Boxing Saves Lives**

Boxing Saves Lives attends school every Tuesday and works with a group of our Year 11 boys. The programme helps them to have a focus on releasing any pent up frustrations in a positive manner. The trainer who attends, speaks to the boys about things that have gone on that week. The trainer, Michelle, runs her own boxing sessions at a gym which two of the students have now started to attend. It is open to all levels, ranging from those who want to compete to those who want to keep fit or improve their mental health. Sessions are one hour long at Lewsey Sports Park Gym in Luton. Juniors 11 yrs to 14 yrs Tuesdays 6pm, Saturdays 1pm. 14yr+ Tuesdays 7pm, Thursdays 7.30pm and Saturday 2pm. On Saturday there is a female only session starting at 10am - 11am. Sessions are £3. It is a positive club with fully qualified coaches.

#### Year 8 and Year 9 Pegsdon Hills Walk

As part of the LEAP programme, students get the opportunity to attend a walking trip. Within LEAP, students have a weekly mentoring session and we find doing this in a different environment away from school can really help our students to open up.

This term a group of Year 8 and 9 students attended Pegsdon Hills on a windy November day. On their walk, they encountered sheep, big hills, big drops, lots of trees to climb and a makeshift swing! Although tired, students said they enjoyed it and it was something different to the norm. They said it allowed them to clear their head and was very calming being in the fresh air. One student liked the views and countryside so much he was now thinking of farming as a career!

## **Luton 2040 Student Voice Conference**

- Luton achieved the best set of GCSE and KS2 results in the whole of Eastern England in 2024
- 3rd lowest carbon emissions in the whole of the UK
- 2nd highest amount of new businesses created in the UK last year (second only to London)

We are so proud of how eloquently and confidently our students spoke, as well as listening to the views of other young people. Students were divided into 2 groups; Tahlia, Head Girl and Grace, Year 10, scribed for both and then Grace and Zoe, Year 10, had the task of presenting the views to the rest of the conference, which they did with ease and brimming with confidence.



## Superstar Year 11 mathematicians reaching beyond GCSEs!

24 Year 11 students are undertaking an extra qualification in further mathematics. These students are tackling problems which would normally be learnt in Year 12 at A-Level; but these students are taking the extra qualification in their own time in Year 11. The material is challenging, and fun, and is a real test of their ability and determination.

The qualification is called the AQA Level 2 Certificate in Further Mathematics and is seen as a stepping stone between GCSE and A-Level. Many of the students who studied the qualification in the last few years, have come back to Lealands and told us how easy the Maths A-Level is! This is largely due to the fact that they are prelearning a large amount of the A-Level course.

There are 6 major topic areas, 4 of which are continuation of the GCSE course, and 2 which are brand new to the students. These are: number, algebra, coordinate geometry, geometry, calculus (new) and matrices (new).


