All of these allow students to gain experiences and knowledge outside of school which enhance their education and support this.

We recently renewed our catering contract with Aspens following excellent feedback from students and staff. Whilst there are continued pressure to increase prices, we have worked hard with the caterers to ensure a substantial healthy meal is available daily for this exceptionally low price. Our student voice group will soon be working with Aspens on some exciting menu developments.

This newsletter also contains information about the development of a Parent Teacher Association.We are pleased to have received a good level of interest from parents/carers regarding this and I am grateful to Mrs Strachan for leading this brilliant development. 
The Foodbank team was blown away by the generosity shown, and our Charity Ambassadors were absolute stars—bagging, boxing, and packing everything up for transportation.
